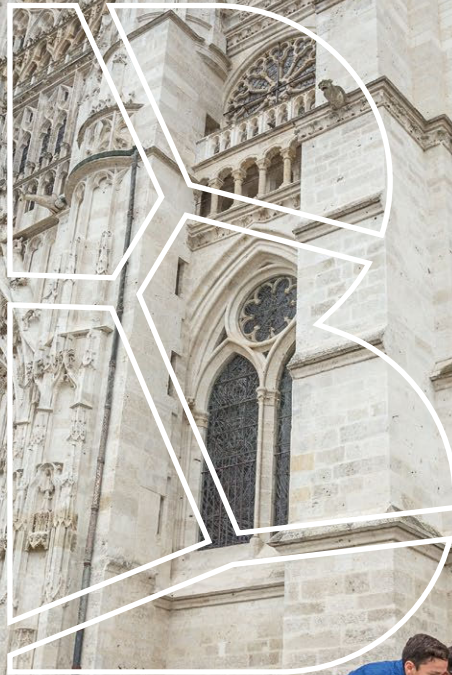

Since 2012, Beauvais has been proud to carry the prestigious "Town of Art and History" award. Awarded by the French Ministry of Culture, this recognition of excellence highlights the richness of our heritage and also rewards the quality of our efforts to raise awareness of the history of Beauvais and its architecture.



Beauvais is a two-thousand-year-old town with its central cathedral boasting the world's tallest Gothic choir; it is a town rich in artisanry that has continued a pottery tradition for several millennia, and which has been home to tapestry production for over 350 years, and a town that has twice won a "fleur d'or" award for its gardens. Beauvais boasts a wide variety of built, intangible and natural heritage. As well as its historic monuments, the town is also full of architectural details that visitors can admire while walking around.

Thanks to the initiatives undertaken to gain the "Town of Art and History" award, this heritage has been made accessible to as many people as possible through the organisation of guided tours, adaptation for young visitors, exhibitions, publications and visitation itineraries.

History and heritage

1 SAINT-PIERRE CATHEDRAL

Saint-Pierre Cathedral dominates the city of Beauvais with its impressive dimensions: its 13th century Gothic choir, 48m high, is the highest in history and was considered the "Parthenon of French architecture" by the famous architectural restorer Eugène Viollet-le-Duc. If it had been completed, Beauvais cathedral would undoubtedly be one of the greatest Gothic buildings in

the world, but the audacity of its builders prevented the nave from being built. Unique consequence: in Beauvais, two cathedrals still stand side by side, as if suspended between two eras. The old cathedral known as "la Basse Œuvre" (The Lower Creation) is a precious testimony to the architecture of the year 1000.

Did you know?

2025: the 800th anniversary of Beauvais Saint-Pierre Cathedral. This will manifest in 12 months of festive, cultural and artistic events, including conferences, concerts, exhibitions and shows in a wide range of fields: the arts, science, literature and even sport!

1 THE CLOCKS OF THE CATHEDRAL

Standing an imposing 12 metres high, Auguste-Lucien Vêrité's astronomical clock is impressive for the wealth of information it displays: seasons, tides, eclipses, etc. This 19th century masterpiece comes to life several times a day, bringing 68 automata to life in perfect synchronisation. A unique experience to share with the whole family! Another treasure within the cathedral is the 14th century medieval clock: one of the oldest working chiming clocks, it is not to be missed. To discover the history of this clock and the cathedral with your family, audio guides are available to hire in 5 languages from the welcome desk.

2 SAINT-ETIENNE CHURCH

A remarkable example of the transition between Romanesque and Gothic art, the church of Saint-Étienne looked over the large number of churches that dotted the historic centre of Beauvais in the Middle Ages, when it was known as a "town of chimies". It still bears a collection of stained glass windows created in the 16th century by the Le Prince family, a dynasty of master glassmakers from Beauvais who were renowned during the Renaissance. The Tree of Jesse, the church's most famous stained glass window, illuminates everything with its brilliant colours.

3 MUDO OISE MUSEUM

The MUDO - Oise Museum is housed in the prestigious palace of the Count-Bishops of Beauvais. As soon as you enter, discover the impressive gatehouse built in the 14th century, the setting for temporary exhibitions. Continue your journey through the gardens to the front and rear of the Renaissance palace. After many months of refurbishment work, the palace reopens its doors on 22 March 2025, with a brand new tour of the 19th and 20th century collections. In spring, the temporary exhibition rooms in the entrance keep will host the Renaissance temporary exhibition, as a part of the reopening of the palace and reflecting its centuries-old history. 4 LE QUADRILATÈRE

After two years of complete restructuring, Le Quadrilatère - Beauvais Art Centre will reopen its doors in April 2025 with a brand new artistic and cultural offering: an ambitious programme of contemporary art spread over 2,000m² and connected with the site's rich past.

At the heart of the visit is a Ciap (Centre for the Interpretation of Architecture and Heritage), a generous exhibition accessible to all, presenting the history and development of the town over the last 2,000 years. Finally, after major excavation works and the creation of a special walkway, the archaeological crypt is now open to the public for the first time. You'll discover the foundations of a Roman public square, as well as many other treasures!

5 SAINT-LAZARE LEPER HOUSE

The Saint-Lazare Leper House is a key heritage and tourist site in the Beauvais area. Built in the 12th and 13th centuries, it is a remarkable example of medieval hospital architecture. The main building, the Romanesque chapel, the barn and its original oak roof frame make up the unique ensemble of what is one of the best-preserved leper houses in Europe. From spring onwards, visitors can also stroll along the paths of the contemporary, medieval-inspired garden. Book an individual or group visit, or try your hand at a fun "escape game", the ideal way to delve into the history of the site and discover it from new angles. An experience not to be missed!

6 TROISSEREUX CHÂTEAU

Welcome to a furnished 15th and 16th century château with a surprising history. The guided tour is led by the owners. Troissereux has a history stretching back two millennia, and the château itself has a very distinctive architectural style. It has an alchemy tower, which is also a chronometric tower, and housed a medieval clock, now on display in the chapel. The architecture of the tower is also surprising in itself: round at the base, it is topped by a square area and then a triangular space.

7 THE GARDEN OF PAINTER ANDRÉ VAN BEEK

A ten-minute drive from Beauvais, don't miss the garden of painter André van Beek in Saint-Paul. With a pallet of colours open to the sky, here the painter draws all his inspiration from dahlias, water lilies and hydrangeas. Here you'll only find calm, tranquility and delight, transported through flower beds and water lily ponds, surrounded by wonders for the eyes. To top it all off, take a detour via the workshop. Between tubes of paint, canvases and brushes, immerse yourself in the romantic atmosphere of the painting gallery and you may even get the chance to see the painter in the midst of his creations.

8 BRULE GARDEN

Located on the road between Beauvais and Gerberoy, the Brule garden in Herchies is a haven of peace on the banks of the river. Water is everywhere, alternating between streams, waterfalls and ponds, a visual delight for visitors. Discover an abundance of greenery intermingled with hydrangeas, asters and dahlias, not forgetting the roses and perennials that adorn the kitchen garden and its 250 varieties of tomatoes. To finish the visit, the small vineyard takes you quietly along the banks of the "Le Thérain" river where cider apple trees are planted, reminding us of our beautiful Picardy region.

Tradition and artisanry

9 NATIONAL MANUFACTORY OF TAPESTRY

Founded in 1664 by Colbert, the Beauvais Tapestry Manufactory was created under the reign of Louis XIV, like the famous Gobelins and Aubusson manufactories. Now housed in the former 19th century town abattoirs, it continues the usage traditional skills, including the *basse-lisse* technique that is the hallmark of Beauvais tapestries. As in the 17th and 18th centuries with Charles Lebrun and François Boucher, great creators are the great artists of the 21st century.

10 MUSEUM OF AVIATION

1,000m² of floor space, 1,000 authentic objects, 1,600 photographs and documents: the Warluis Aviation Museum is a passionate testimony to the history of aviation, but above all it tells the story of the airmen at the heart of the tragedy of the Second World War.

In the cabins, there were men, heroes! New items are regularly added to this collection, which is unique in France and traces part of the region's history. A place to meet, exchange ideas and share experiences, run by a voluntary association, a meeting place for enthusiasts, a lesson in courage, a historical fresco accessible to all audiences.

A local living museum! This is where the "Beauvaisis steam train" operates, with its trains classified as Historic Monuments.

HIKING

Take in the fresh air on hilly trails, peaceful forests or landscaped greenways, and get away from it all. The Tourist Office has signposted footpaths for you to explore, alternating between the villages and their small heritage sites, the cereal-growing plains with their shimmering early summer colours, the banks of bucolic rivers such as the Liovette through Guignecourt and the shady paths through the forest at La Neuville-en-Hez. This beech and oak forest, part of which is state-owned, offers a number of footpaths, a botanical trail and 4 remarkable trees: the chandelier oak, the Saint-Lucien oak, the Saint-Louis oak and the Croix-le-Comte beech.

Along the way, you'll come across other curiosities such as a tithe barn, ancient graffiti, the remains of a castle or abbey or a monumental wine press... They'll be just some of the highlights of your discoveries.

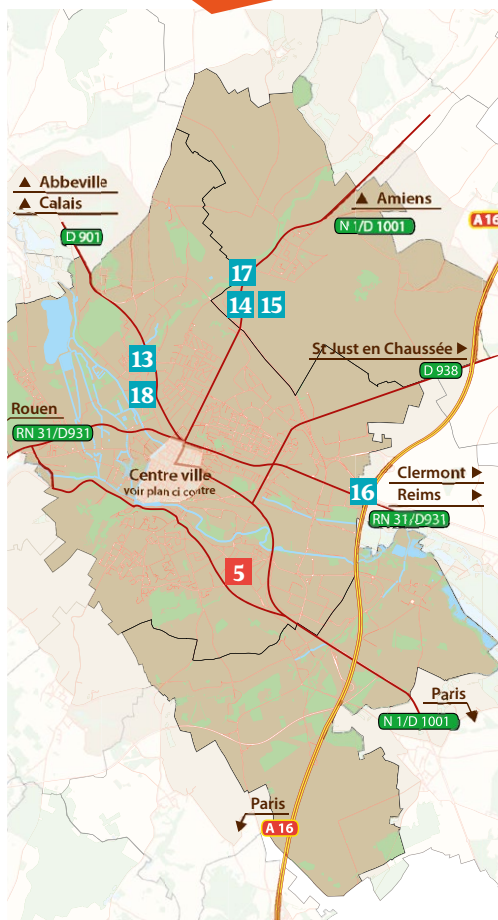

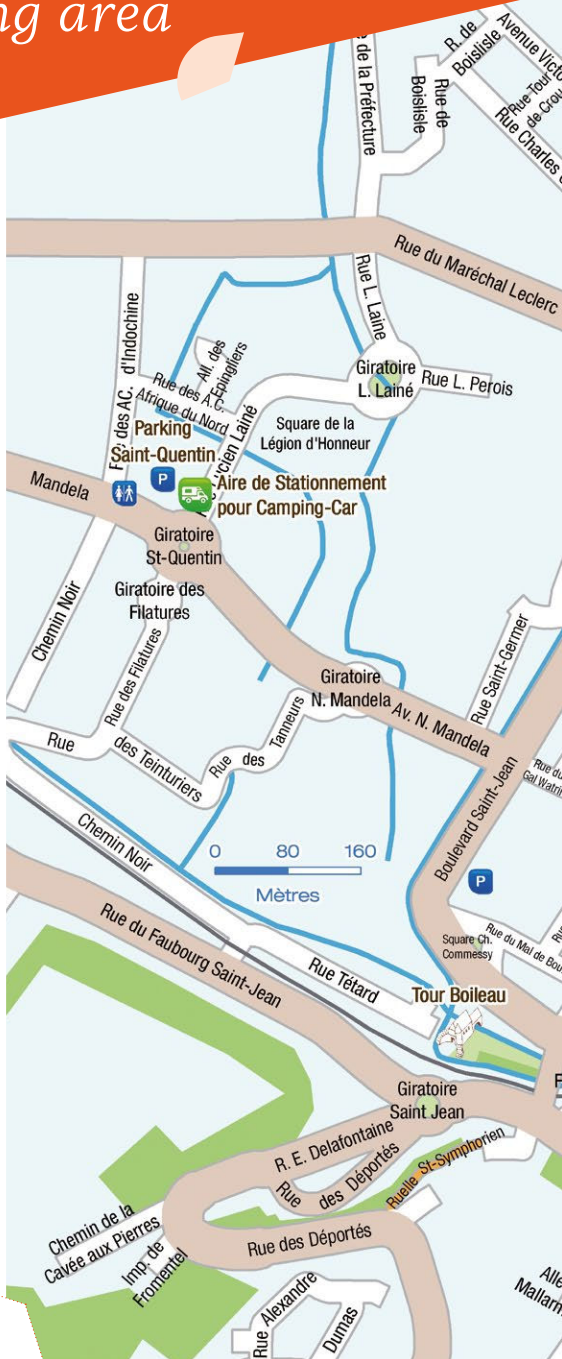
